Dear Friends

Where are we going as a congregation?

Recently a few of us attended a very inspiring evening when Tommy MacNeil, a Church of Scotland minister in Stornoway, introduced his book 'Sleeping Giant: A Call to the Church to Awake and Arise!' I would encourage folk to read the book – maybe you would like an opportunity to meet and discuss what it says? He writes 'The Church of Jesus Christ has the potential of being a giant, a friendly giant, a giant in how we love God and those around us, a giant who works for the good of others and ultimately for the glory of God. But we've allowed ourselves to be bound; we've allowed external forces to dictate the direction of our lives.'

As elders we believe God has plans for his Church locally as part of what he is doing across Scotland and beyond. Together as a congregation we can discover more about what he wants us to be and do in this bigger picture. We hope you will journey with us as we pray and explore the way ahead!

Some time ago the elders agreed we should focus on several areas of the work to build on what has been happening in recent years. As a result, we have set up four small teams involving elders and others. These are **Ministry** to help us develop services etc, **Discipleship/ Growth** to help us with small group studies, prayer etc, **Community Engagement/ Outreach** – to help develop what we do in and for the local area and **Pastoral Care** to ensure there is good care and support for everyone.

We believe we should seek to have a minister (full-time or part-time) to share with us in the work and to encourage, stimulate and support us in moving forward together to become the church God wants us to be and to serve him faithfully in the local community and in our personal lives.

Progress on the buildings project has been slow but we now have the necessary building warrants and other permissions for the work to go ahead. We hope soon to have detailed quotations for the various parts of the project and we can then decide on how best to proceed and seek the additional funding we will need.

Please continue to pray about all of this, for one another, for the community around us and for our fellow Christians locally. Pray that God will bring other people to join us as he has done in recent years but that we will also be ready to go and engage with people where they are. Thank you to everyone who shares in the life and work of our congregation and it is such a help when everyone plays their part as they are able. Let's look forward with anticipation of the next steps God has for us!
